

**CITY OF GASSVILLE, ARKANSAS
MINUTES FOR THE REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING
FEBRUARY 19, 2015**

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Gassville, Arkansas was held on Thursday, February 19, 2015 at the Gassville Community Center. The meeting had been postponed from the previously scheduled date of Tuesday, February 17th. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by Mayor Jeff Braim, Presiding Officer. The Mayor led those in attendance in saying the pledge of allegiance to the flag and in offering a word of prayer.

Upon the calling of the roll, those in attendance were Alderman Kayla Holland, Alderman Tim McFarland, Alderman Anita Seaman, Alderman Rick Peglar, Mayor Jeff Braim, and Recorder-Treasurer Jeff Lewis. Alderman Ralph Bird arrived after the meeting had begun. Alderman Naomi Lassen was absent. Department Heads in attendance were Police Chief Tim Mayfield, Fire Chief Bill Johnson, Water and Street Superintendent Tony Flippin, and City Inspector Maynard Gadway.

The minutes from the January 20, 2015 council meeting were submitted for approval. Alderman McFarland moved to approve the minutes, with a second from Alderman Seaman. There were no additions or corrections asked for, whereupon the Mayor called for the vote. Alderman Holland, Alderman McFarland, Alderman Seaman, Alderman Peglar, and Alderman Bird voted for the motion. There were no nays, and the Mayor declared the motion carried and the minutes to be approved as presented.

The financial statement for the month of January, 2015 was submitted for approval. Alderman Peglar moved to approve the financial statement as presented. This motion was seconded by Alderman McFarland. The Mayor handed out replacement sheets for the general fund financial report, pages 5, 6, 7, and 8, in substitution of those previously delivered to council members. He explained corrections that were made to police department income line item 1232 (miscellaneous income) and police department expense line items 1474 (police maintenance/operations) and 1517 (police misc.). These changes were made to reflect activity concerning the repair of damage to the 2009 Dodge Charger police vehicle, which has now been fully repaired. There were no questions or comments, and the Mayor called for a vote on the motion to approve. Alderman Holland, Alderman McFarland, Alderman Seaman, Alderman Peglar, and Alderman Bird voted for the motion. There were no nays, and the Mayor declared the motion carried and the financial report to stand approved.

Police Chief Mayfield gave the police department report for the month of January, 2015. It was accepted into the record without comment or objection.
